Very good (bdb; 5,0): very good knowledge of problems and poetics of both: works discussed during the course and suggested for individual reading; ability to indicate and explain main issues in contemporary Polish literature; ability to situate the most important Polish literary works in the cultural context and the context of world literature; ability to independently interpret and evaluate a work; good knowledge on reception of discussed works

Good plus (+db; 4,5): the same with some minor shortcomings especially in the field of reception

Good (db; 4,0): wider range of shortcomings is possible; weaker practical skills – to write and to reason in favour of a thesis proposed

Unsatisfactory (ndst; 2,0): unsatisfactory knowledge of works and contemporary literature contexts; serious shortcomings in interpretative skills
